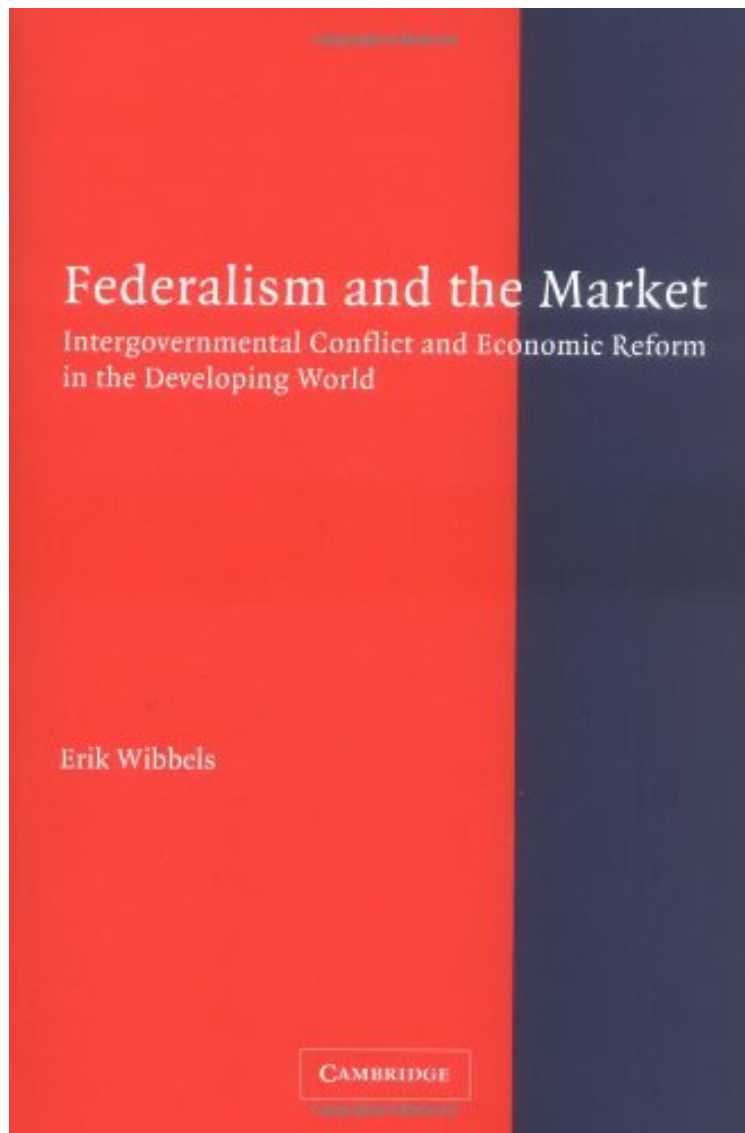


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Federalism and the Market: Intergovernmental Conflict and Economic Reform in the Developing World
