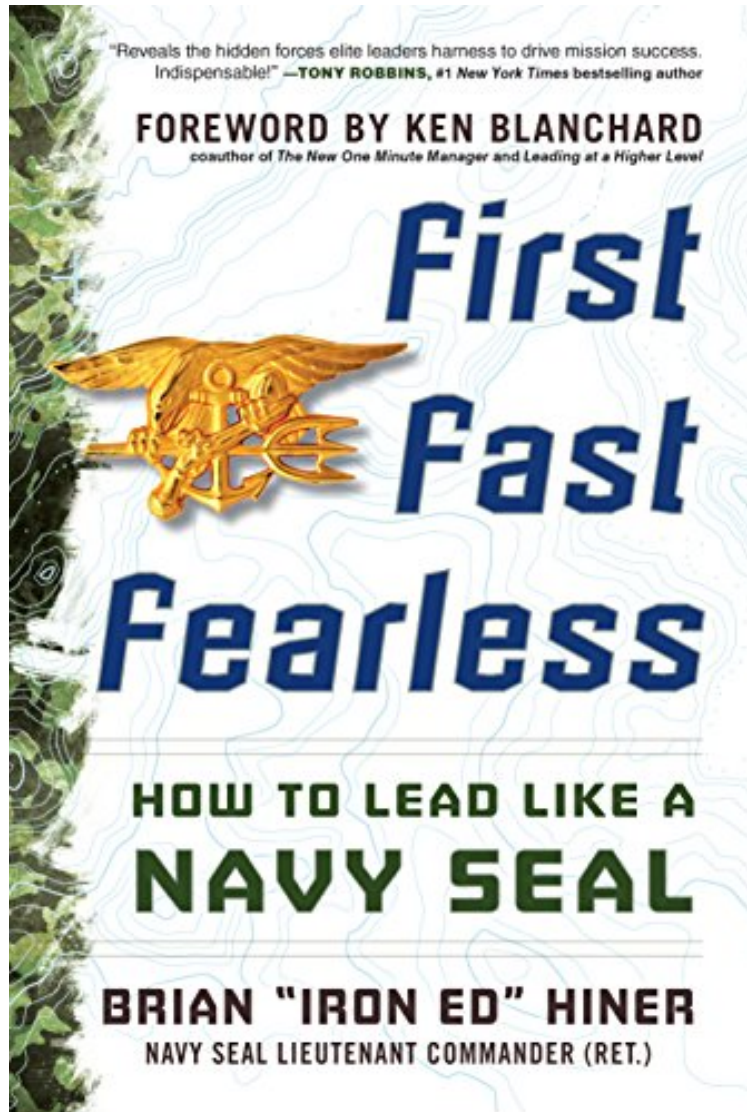

Your Leadership "Swim Buddy" By Jeremy Donovan This outstanding book covers several concepts used by Navy SEALs that can be readily applied to business leaderships including: 1. Swim buddies: Everyone, from new hires to senior leaders, should have a "swim buddy"; to whom they are jointly accountable and with whom they are equally able to lead and to follow 2. First strike thinking:

“You don’t leave things up to chance; you go on the offensive” to treat every moment as an opportunity. Do not dwell on unfairness or wear your negative emotions on your sleeve.³ Sea Stories: Use stories to indoctrinate new candidates with your company’s ethos⁴. Leaders eat last: “Take care of your men and they will take care of you.” In addition, no special privileges for leaders. “Leaders should understand that they are on stage all the time and that their people are watching and judging every aspect of their actions.”⁵ Rule Bending: We want “SEALs to be mission driven, innovative rule benders, not rule breakers.”⁶ Team First/Working Backward: “We deal with team issues first, followed by Task Unit issues and [then] individual issues.”⁷ Inside the perimeter: It is the leader’s responsibility to keep infighting, conflict, contempt, and toxic individuals outside of the team so that team members develop trust. However, good peer pressure is encouraged.⁸ Toxic leaders: Accept that you will not be able to change them. “The best thing you can do is to get outside their perimeter, to step aside gracefully, if you can.”⁹ Followership: “As a leader, you still follow — you follow those in the know and those with the right experience — in spite of your rank or title.”¹⁰ Let your people be winners: When you are dealing with problems, allow your team “to find the solution and go with their plan when it makes sense. Give them guidance, but let them decide and be in control as much as possible, so they can have ownership.”¹¹ “You fight for a democracy, but you don’t work for one”: Dissent behind closed doors while making a decision is encouraged. However, once the decision is made, do not complain about it to subordinates.¹² BLUF: Share the bottom line up front¹³. Leader’s Intent: When delegating, share three things: (a) purpose, key tasks, and end state (b) appropriate guidance when appropriate for more complex assignments (c) priorities¹⁴. After Action Review (AAR): After each project, meet and answer (a) What did we intend to do? (b) What happened? (c) What went wrong? (d) What went right (e) What do we have to fix?¹⁵ Front Sight Focus: Know the end goal, but stay focused on the key steps to get there. In addition, the book covers the usual leadership genre ground of: accountability; adaptability; mental toughness, courage perseverance; bias for action; decisiveness; creative thinking problem solving; moral courage (honesty, humility, dependability, emotional fortitude); teamwork⁴ of 4 people found the following review helpful.
