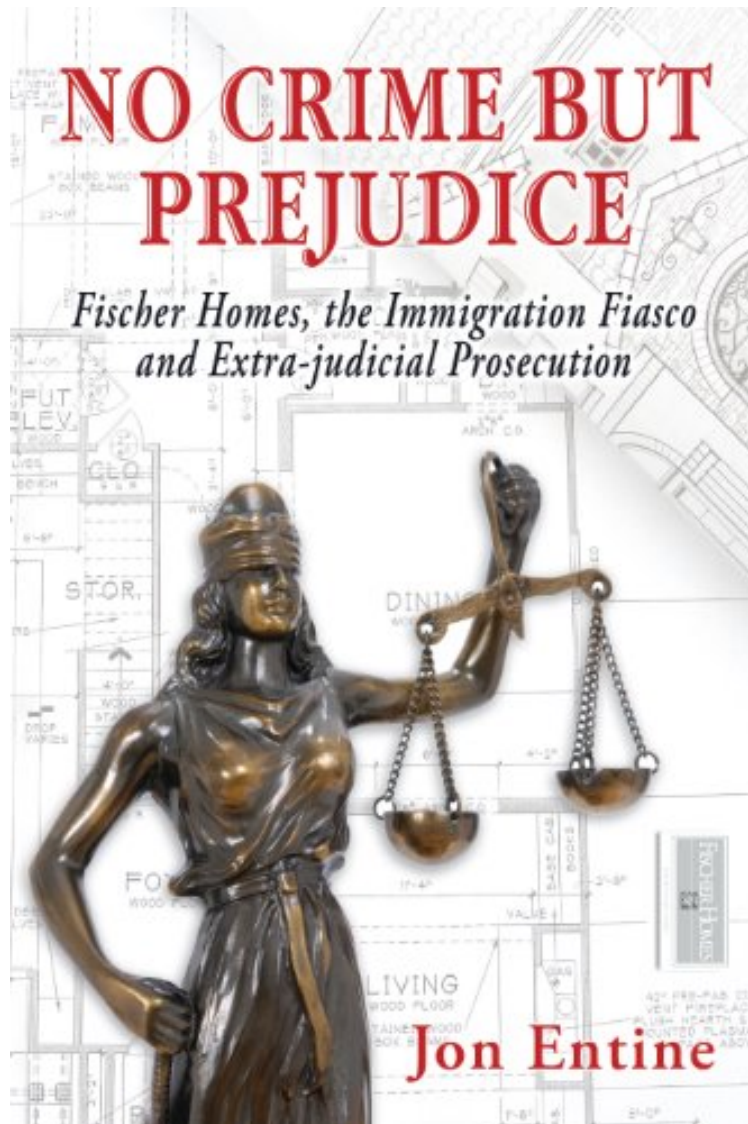

In my opinion this book should be read as a warning to all honest, honorable business owners and their honest and honorable employees: Be wary of what you say around prosecutors and their minions because even before a case gets to court they could twist your innocent phrases into connotations that suit their purpose and that damn you forever. In fact, lawyer friends of my family, when I was growing up, have said to just remain silent around authorities until and unless you have an attorney as a witness

with you. Even then you should remain silent and let the attorney do the talking. When you read this book you will learn more about how your words can be twisted. You will also learn that what we were told about publicity when we were children in middle school is exemplified in this book: That is, that you should not believe everything you read in the newspaper and very little of what you might see in news photographs. Headlines can often be deceiving especially when their singular purpose is to sell newspapers, and even pre-digital photographs can easily be manipulated to deceive the eye. Fortunately for the Fischer family and their employees they won the hard-earned fight against the tactics employed against them.
